MISSIONS TO HAITI

God is on mission! God sent His Son to save people, and then He sent His church to proclaim the good news to the world. As a church, one of our core values is "Adventure – A place to be involved in the task of reaching all nations." We realize that we must be involved in the mission of God, not just in Eureka, but all over the world.

God has given us a great opportunity to send people on that adventure this summer. We are going to send a team of people to Haiti during the week of July 9-15. For the trip, Genesis will partner with a ministry called Amer-Haitian Bon Zami (AHBZ), a Christian organization that runs an orphanage for girls, a Christian school, and is developing a medical clinic. Scott and Leslie Holdegraver from Genesis are on the Board of Directors for the ministry, and Scott is leading the trip. On this trip, the group will be doing some ministry with children such as a Vacation Bible School, will do some painting and other light maintenance work on facilities, and will help organize a kindergarten graduation for the school.

ANSWERS TO IMPORTANT QUESTIONS

Where exactly are we going?

Tabarre is a suburb or Port-au-Prince, the capital of Haiti, located in the Caribbean between Cuba and the Dominican Republic.

Who is Amer-Haitian Bon Zami?

A Christian organization that is based here in St. Louis, with almost all of their board members living here. The ministry oversees three ventures. First, they run the House of Hope Orphanage, which cares for poor and abandoned girls in Haiti. Second, they have a Christian school called Patti School. The girls from the orphanage attend school there, but it is also open to other children from the area. The ministry also owns the House of Hope Clinic, which provides some medical care for children at the school and in the area.

The mission of AHBZ and HOH is to care for the orphaned and abandoned children of Haiti, preparing them to be well-rounded adults, physically, emotionally, and spiritually, who can provide for themselves and their impoverished nation and to establish a bond of friendship and understanding between Americans and Haitians.

What is the cost?

The trip will cost somewhere around \$1,000-\$1,200 depending on the cost of air-fare. Most of the expense is for the travel to and from Tabarre, but this cost also includes most of the meals, lodging, and transportation costs in country.

While this is a considerable expense, for an international trip, this is very

economical. All payments for this trip will be made directly to Genesis Church, and for the most part are non-refundable (if tickets have been purchased and other expenses paid).

How can I come up with this money?

If you believe God is leading you on this trip, he will provide. We can help you with a plan to raise some funds for the trip. Friends, family, and spiritual mentors will be willing to help you go on an adventure like this. All contributions to this trip, including your payments are tax-deductible charitable contributions.

Why should I go on a trip like this?

There are a lot of answers, both biblically and practically, but here are three. First, it will change your life! Not much in the world will impact you the way doing missions in a third-world country will. Second, God will use you in a HUGE way. There is no way to explain the difference that can be made in people's lives when a team of people following Jesus come and invest their lives in Kingdom of God work. Third, going on a trip like this is part of fulfilling the commands of Jesus. Jesus told his disciples, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." When people go on a trip like this they are obeying Jesus and are participating in the mission of God by caring for the poor, sharing the Gospel with those who do not know Christ, and learning to love others as Christ loves us.

Who can go?

Any person in high school or above is welcome! Those who are under 18 will need their parent's permission, of course. This is an entry level trip. Participants do not need any certain skill set to go, other than a willingness to allow God to use them. The group will be trained for the project.

What if I want to consider going?

This trip to Haiti will be a great chance to go on a crazy adventure for Jesus. It will be a fantastic "get your feet wet" trip for those who have never been on an international trip, and will also be a great experience for people who would like to explore God's call on their lives. So here is what you should do. First, pray, and ask God if you should consider going on this trip. Second, pick up a packet and check out the ministry website. You can also visit their trip information page (http://ahbz.org/workteams.php). Anyone thinking about this trip should plan on attending the meeting at the start of March. The deadline to register for the trip will be Sunday March 8.

What about the meeting on March 1

We will also have a meeting at noon on Sunday March 1 at the home of Jim and Deanna Breeden (23 Hawk Hill Rd., in Eureka). The plan for the meeting is to have everyone grab their own lunch and bring it to the Breeden's home. The directors of Amer-Haitian Bon Zami will be with us at this meeting to give complete details about their ministry and how our team will be able to serve them, as well as other trip details. We will also give people ideas for raising money for a trip of this nature during this meeting.

How Do I register?

To register for the trip, you will need to turn in the attached forms along with a \$200 deposit by Sunday March 8. The forms include our health form, the Participant Information Form, and the Personal Health History form. Students who are under 18 years of age will need to have these forms signed by their parents and notarized.

Who is leading the trip?

Scott & Leslie Holdegraver are on the board of AHBZ, and Scott is leading the trip. The Holdegravers have been attending Genesis for several months. At least one of the Genesis elders will also be going on this trip.

Where can I get more information?

WHAT TO BRING

Antibacterial hand wipes.

Bible, Journal, pens and pencils

Camera, film and extra batteries (put in your carry-on)

Clothing:

<u>Ladies</u> - Dresses, skirts, capri pants, and short sleeve tops are acceptable anywhere in Haiti. It is acceptable to wear shorts and sleeveless tops while working at HOH only. Please do not wear tank tops or midriff-bearing tops during this trip. Undergarments should be covered by clothes. *For travel to Haiti*, please wear a dress, skirt, or pants. *For Church*: Please wear a dress or skirt and blouse. Close-toed shoes are preferred. <u>Men</u> – Long pants, shorts and comfortable shirts are appropriate to wear while in Haiti. Long pants should be worn during travel to Haiti, and certain activities planned during the trip may require long pants. Appropriate t-shirts are fine for most activities. *For Church*: Dress pants, a dress shirt, and tie. Comfortable dress-type shoes. <u>For everyone</u>: Bring cool, comfortable sleepwear.

2-3 Water bottles (We refill them with purified water.)

Flashlight and extra batteries

Insect repellent – with DEET – no aerosol

Personal medications in original packaging (We have first-aid supplies on-hand.)

Passport, as well as a COPY of your passport to be given to your team leader.

Phone numbers of family and friends

Money for souvenirs (preferably \$1 bills). Carry money in a money belt.

Backpack or bag to carry "stuff" while on the field

Snacks you cannot do without (An assortment of snacks are provided.)

Sunglasses and sunscreen

Toilet articles - toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, deodorant, etc.

Towels and washcloths

Supplies for projects that are planned – to be determined.

Toilet paper – please bring 4 rolls.

Set of sheets and pillowcases – twin size.
