Week 1

Hebrews 4:14-16 Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

Sometimes we think of God as being far off, way up in heaven. We somewhat believe that God cannot really understand what I am going through, or how I feel. This passage reminds us that just the opposite is true. Jesus can say, "If you would only listen to Me, I've been where you are!" He experienced every situation and every temptation known to man. Jesus experienced the pressures of human life. He went through puberty, knew what it was like to be a single adult, dealt with loss of loved ones, and had people who were close to him sell him out and abandon him. He was tempted with sex, and with drugs (they tried to give him drugs on the cross and He refused them), with power, and money. He was challenged to give in to His desires and take the selfish way out.

Yet, there is one major difference. Jesus never failed! He never gave in to those temptations. He never sinned. Now, this could mean that Jesus could look at us and say, "You'll never be as good as I am, so don't even try." Our tendency is to look at our failures which leave us feeling guilty and unworthy. But the message of the Gospel is that Christ understands our struggles and invites us to come into His presence. While prayer is not the only way this happens, it is a key path to the very throne room of Jesus. His desire is that we come to Him to learn how to live. He wants us to come boldly and with confidence.

The High Priest was the "go between" for God to the people. He made the sacrifices and became God's spokesman to the people. But the Jewish High Priests were flawed and sinful. When they made sacrifices, they had to make them for their own sins as well. But Jesus is the perfect High Priest who made the perfect sacrifice. Because He is a High Priest who understands our weakness, but also overcame temptation, we can trust Him. Most important, through Him, we have direct access into the presence of God. Therefore, we can "come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in the time of need."

Do you understand prayer in this way? An invitation from a perfect Savior who has experienced everything in our humanity, but he did not fail. Now he invites us into His presence to be a source of encouragement and strength in our greatest need.

Week 2

Isaiah 6.5 esv And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!"

A few years ago, I was in a bible study group where the subject about the fear of the Lord came up. Our teacher summed it up like this: "to fear the Lord is to FEAR the Lord". There's no other way to put it. There's no Greek word study that says that the word fear means to respect. Every time someone in the Bible comes face to face with the full glory of God, their reaction is that they become completely undone.

This is at the very heart of repentance. Because of the finished work of Jesus, our prayers reach the Throne of God just as if we were face to face.

For years, my attitude about repentance was "I'm sorry, I'll do better". "I'll do better" isn't even mentioned in this verse. Isaiah didn't present his Holy To-do list. Our attitude toward repentance should reflect Isaiah. Complete and utter surrender to the holiness of God and the rejection of anything unclean in our life.

Isaiah not only repented for himself, but also his people. When we pray to the living God, we also need to pray on behalf on His people who are dishonoring Him constantly. Repentance isn't just a solo effort, it's something we do while living in community with other believers.

This month, take the time to let the Holy Spirit show you the Biblical way to repent. Not only for yourself, but for those around you as well.

Psalm 100, A Psalm for Thanksgiving

Verses 4 and 5: Enter His gates with thanksgiving, and His courts with praise. Give thanks to Him; bless His name. For the Lord is good; His loving kindness is everlasting, and His faithfulness to all generations.

Do you have to remind yourself to start your prayers with thanksgiving? I hope I'm not the only one! Praising our awesome God for who He is, the amazing Creator of the universe, the Holy One - should always be the start of my prayer time. Scripture: John 17

Did you know Jesus prayed for you? Yep! He sure did! John 17 is the real Lord 's Prayer. We call the prayer that begins, "Our Father, which art in heaven..." the Lord's Prayer, but it is really a model for our prayer. But in John 17, Jesus has an intense prayer time for Himself, His disciples, and finally for all who would believe in Him. Jesus knew he was about to go to the cross, and He wanted His final hours to be focused on His Father and His mission. In this prayer, Jesus prayed for you, and for me, and for all who would believe in Him.

There are so many things Jesus could have prayed when He prayed for us. He could have prayed for our well being and our health. That would have made Him a good religious guy. I've been to a lot of Christian prayer meetings, and it seems that we spend most of our prayer time praying for Aunt Bertha's big toe, or Ole' Brother Jones rickety old knees. Now, while I know that God cares about every need, it seems that when we gather for prayer, there are greater issues than the health of Christian people. In fact, it has been said that we spend more time praying to keep saved people out of heaven than we spend praying to keep lost people out of hell. Notice that Jesus didn't pray for our health.

He also could have prayed for our peace and well being. He could have asked God to keep His followers from harm, and to protect them from any persecution that might come their way. As I listen to prayers for those going on mission trips or other Christian journeys, the prayer for safety seems to be the number one request. "Lord, keep the group safe on their trip. Don't let them encounter any struggles or persecution on their way. Yet, for some odd reason, this doesn't seem important to Jesus at the time. Actually, I believe Jesus realized that the Christian life is not safe. Jesus was going to the cross, which was not safe. He would endure persecution, name calling, and ultimately an incredible sacrifice for our salvation. And He realized that those who are passionate for Him will find the same persecution awaiting them.

Jesus also didn't pray that the Father, or the Son, or the Spirit would "be with" us as Christians. How many times have you heard the prayer, "God, be with" so and so. Funny how this sort of prayer never crossed Jesus mouth. Actually, this sort of prayer is unbiblical and demonstrates lack of faith. God has promised that He will always be with us, and never forsake us. His presence is sure.

So what does Jesus ask of God when He is praying for you and for me? First, He prays for our unity. He asks God to give us a supernatural connection with one another that will cause the world to take notice. Jesus knows that the only way the church can be strong is if the church is unified. A divided church will never be an evangelistic church. Second, Jesus prays that we would reflect His glory. He prays that our lives together would be a light shining in the darkness. Third, Jesus prays that you and I would make Christ known to the world around us.

Pretty cool, eh! Jesus prayed for you. And when Jesus prays, God answers. But this is also a good reminder about what should be the heart of our prayers.

Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, 29 yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. 30 But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? 31 Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' 32 For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. 33 But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

34 "Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.

Many times in my life, I have let anxiety take over my thoughts, making me forget that everything in my life is truly in God's hands. It is easy to believe that God's will is what guides me when life is going smoothly, but when I hit a rough patch, it is my tendency to lean on my own thoughts to solve my problems. It is when I realize that I can't fix things on my own that I feel anxious and uncertain.

That You May Know 1 JOHN 5:13-15

13 I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God that you may know that you have eternal life. 14 And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. 15 And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him.

WOW! Prayer is powerful. God hears us and he is a loving father who wants what is best for us. Be encouraged and know that He is able to answer all your requests. Paul encouraged the church to pray without ceasing. The difficult thing for me is that little phrase "according to his will". Even though we may want God to end our "pain and suffering", He always does what is best for us eternally. Daniel 3:26-28 Then Nebuchadnezzar came near to the door of the burning fiery furnace; he declared, "Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, servants of the Most High God, come out, and come here!" Then Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego came out from the fire. And the satraps, the prefects, the governors, and the king's counselors gathered together and saw that the fire had not had any power over the bodies of those men. The hair of their heads was not singed, their cloaks were not harmed, and no smell of fire had come upon them. Nebuchadnezzar answered and said, "Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, who has sent his angel and delivered his servants, who trusted in him, and set aside the king's command, and yielded up their bodies rather than serve and worship any god except their own God...."

As I read this scripture, I pray for myself and Genesis Church to have the desire to yield (surrender) totally to God by truly trusting Him with my/our life (His will, not mine/ours), and setting aside all of this world's temporary pleasures/demands for Him to have priority in my/our life. When the son was 3 he came home from a good news club singing "Jesus loves Me" and "Jesus loves the little children".
